AIKEN, S.C. (July 19, 2011) – In December 2010, Savannah River Nuclear Solutions, LLC announced dates for thirty Savannah River Site (SRS) public tours that would take place in 2011.

The general site driving tours of SRS offered to the public provide opportunities for approximately 1,500 people to visit the site to better understand the Department of Energy's facilities and operations that once changed the face of Aiken, Barnwell and Allendale Counties. 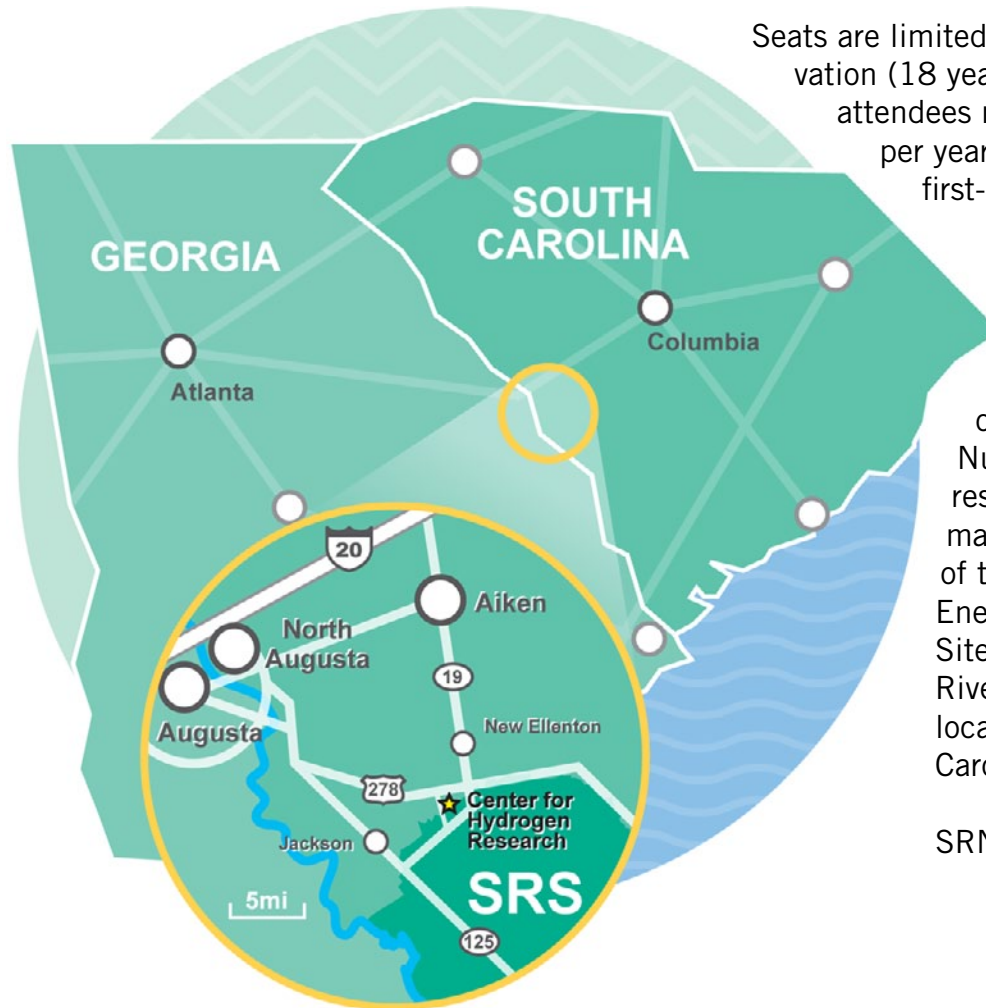
Tour check-in begins at 12:30 p.m. at the Aiken County South Carolina Center for Hydrogen Research, located off highway 278,
